The College and Schools

The University of Mississippi comprises the <u>College of Liberal Arts</u> and several schools, including the schools of <u>Accountancy</u>, <u>Applied Sciences</u>, <u>Business</u> <u>Administration</u>, <u>Education</u>, <u>Engineering</u>, <u>Journalism and New Media</u>, <u>Pharmacy</u>, <u>Law</u>, and the <u>Graduate School</u> — all located on the Oxford campus. The <u>Bachelor of General Studies degree program</u> is administered through the Office of the Provost. Students of all majors may participate in the <u>Sally</u> <u>McDonnell Barksdale Honors College</u> through competitive admission. The <u>Division of Outreach and Continuing Education</u> supervises the university's regional campuses in <u>Southaven</u>, <u>Tupelo</u>, <u>Grenada</u> and Booneville and offers online and independent study, study abroad, as well as high school, summer, and personal-enrichment courses.

The University of Mississippi Medical Center in Jackson houses the schools of Medicine, Nursing, Health Related Professions, Dentistry, and Graduate Studies in the Health Sciences, and the University Hospitals and Clinics.
