The M.S. in communication sciences and disorders is designed for students who are interested in the study of speech-language pathology, the study of habilitation and rehabilitation of communication disorders and swallowing disorders.

Course Requirements

Course requirements are a minimum of 36 academic course hours, 15 hours of clinical practicum, and 10 hours of graduate seminar. Academic course requirements are CD 505, 513, 521, 522, 523, 526, 531, 532, 541, 557, 613, 620, 627, 642, and 605. Clinical course requirements are five semesters of clinical practicum (CD 595) and five semesters of clinical seminar (CD 592).

Other Academic Requirements

Graduate students have a thesis option, requiring at least 6 hours of thesis credit in addition to the required didactic and clinical practicum courses. Students must pass a comprehensive examination in the last semester of enrollment.
