Phcy 100 provides firstyear Early Entry students an introduction to important academic, professional, and personal skills necessary to succeed in pharmacy school and the practice of pharmacy. This course will include participatory exposure to problem-based active learning and team-based learning and an overview of the pharmacy profession, opportunities for involvement with the University of Mississippi School of Pharmacy, and an introduction to personal and professional development skills.
