Degree Requirements

REQUIREMENT	HOURS	DESCRIPTION
First Year Writing I	3	Complete <u>Hon 101, Writ 100</u> or <u>Writ 101</u> with a passing grade.
First Year Writing II	3	Complete one of the following courses with a passing grade: Liba 102, Writ 102 or Hon 102.
6 hrs literature survey	6	Complete 6 hours of literature survey with a passing grade. Choose from the following courses: Eng 220, 221, 222, 223, 224, 225, or Eng 226.
6 hrs modern/ancient language 200+	6	Successfully complete at least 6 hours at the 200 level or above in one modern or ancient language.
6 hrs history	6	Complete 6 hours in History (HST) course work with a passing grade.
3 hrs humanities	3	Successfully complete 3 hours in one of the following areas: African-American studies; classical civilization; environmental studies (<u>Envs 101</u>); gender studies (<u>G St 201, 301, 333, 350</u>); philosophy; religion; Southern studies (<u>S St 101, 102</u>). In addition, gender studies courses that are cross-listed with African American studies, classical civilization, English, modern languages, philosophy, or religion courses will satisfy this requirement.
6 hrs social science	6	Successfully complete 6 semester hours in anthropology, economics, political science, psychology, or sociology.
3 hrs fine arts	3	The course may be chosen from art history, music, dance, and theatre arts. Studio and workshop courses cannot be used to satisfy this requirement. Courses that satisfy this requirement are any Art History (AH); Liba 130, 204, 314; Mus 101, 102, 103, 104, 105; Danc 200; Thea 201, 202. Students who have completed 30 semester hours of undergraduate course work may fulfill the requirement with a 300- or 400-level art history course.
3 hrs math 100+	3	Successfully complete 3 hours of Math at the 100 level or above except for Math 245 and Math 246.
9-12 hrs science	9	Complete a full year of science course work in one subject area (6-8 hrs) and complete 3 credit hours in a subject area from another department. Courses may be chosen from the departments of Biology, Chemistry and Biochemistry, Geology and Geological Engineering, or Physics and Astronomy.
2 associated science labs	2	Successfully complete at least two science laboratory courses.

European History electives	6	Complete 6 hrs from the following European history courses with a grade of C or better: <u>Hst 101, 102, 348, 349, 350, 351, 352, 353, 354, 355, 356, 357, 358, 359, 360,361, 362, 363, 364, 365, 366, 367, 368, 369, 370, 371, 372, 373, 374, 375, 376, 377, 378, 379, 380, 445, or 450.</u>
Other Regional History electives	6	Complete 6 hrs from the following list of history of other regions with a grade of C or better: <u>Hst 160, 170, 180, 185, 343, 344, 345, 346, 381, 383, 384, 385, 386, 387, 388, 389, 390, 391, 392, 393, 394, 395, 396, 398, 460, 470</u> , or <u>480</u> .
Additional History electives	15	Successfully complete an additional 15 credit hours of history courses. A minimum grade of C is required in all history courses applied by a student toward a major in history.
History Survey electives	9	A maximum of three survey-level courses (100-level courses) applied toward a major in history.
History residency hrs	12	Students must earn at least 12 hours of their major courses in residence.
