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M.Ed. in Counselor Education Description

The M.Ed. in counselor education must be completed with either an option in school counseling or community counseling. The program requires satisfactory completion of courses and course experiences, development of basic counseling skills, performance in practicum and internship, and demonstration of specific clinical competencies beyond class requirements.

Minimum Total Credit Hours: 60

The general objective of the M.Ed. in counseling is to prepare students to be professional counselors. The counselor education faculty believe that the development of a strong professional identity, a rich knowledge base, and expertise in the skills of counseling are essential to becoming a professional counselor. Emphasis - School Counseling Description

The M.Ed. in counselor education must be completed with an emphasis in either school counseling or clinical mental health counseling. The program requires satisfactory completion of a minimum of 48 credits. Specific requirements include satisfactory completion of courses and course experiences, development of basic counseling skills, performance in practicum and internship, and demonstration of specific competencies beyond class requirements.
