

### Phcy 451: Pharmacogenomics School of Pharmacy

This course is designed to provide students with an integrated knowledge base in pharmacogenomics. Interpretation of pharmacogenomic information is a critical step in the patient care process. It is an imperative step to identifying and preventing medication-related problems and developing patient-centered solutions. The primary purpose of this course is to prepare students for the understanding of drug selection pertinent to the treatment and resolution of clinical syndromes. Key concepts will be reinforced through the application of learned knowledge demonstrated in a final capstone project. 2 Credits
