Academic Regulations

CSci 111 is the typical first computer science course for those studying in the B.S.C.S. program, the B.A. computer science major, the computer science minor, the computer engineering emphasis in electrical engineering, and the management information systems program in the School of Business Administration. Typical first courses for other students would include CSci 103, 191, and 251.

Students admitted to the university in accordance with stated admission policies may then declare their chosen degree program.

Graduate Studies

M.S. and Ph.D. entrance requirements are those of the Graduate School. M.S. applicants are expected to possess or be in the process of completing an undergraduate degree in engineering or closely related field from an accredited institution. In general, Ph.D. applicants are expected to possess or be in the process of completing a master's degree. In certain cases, applicants completing an undergraduate degree in engineering or closely related field from an accredited institution and undergraduate degree in engineering or closely related field from an accredited institution may be considered.
