

Psy 713: Advanced Social Cognition

Social cognition is an integrative field that combines the theories and methodologies of social psychology with cognitive psychology to understand how we think about and make sense of our social worlds. The course covers topics such as dual modes of social thinking (automatic and controlled), social perception and inference/judgment, self-concept and self-regulation, attitudes, stereotyping and prejudice, and the interplay of affect-cognition-behavior. 3 Credits
