

Psy 759: Clinical-Disaster Psychology

This course delineates the role of clinical psychologists in the field of disaster mental health, preparing them for working in this context with respect to disaster preparedness, mitigation, response, and recovery. Covers topics such as psychopathology after disasters, vulnerability and resilience, special populations, and related mental health interventions and services, including models of psychological first aid (PFA).
