

Anth 345: Korea: People, Places, and Futures Sociology & Anthropology

This course is an introduction to the society and geography of North and South Korea addressing contemporary issues of race, gender, sexuality, generation, kinship, and trans/national identity formation through topics such as political ideology, K-pop, transnational adoption, the sex industry, and defection from North Korea. Emphasis will be placed on geographically situating these topics, especially in the dynamic neighborhoods of Seoul and in Korea's landscapes most marked by division and war.
