## **Degree Requirements**

REQUIREMENT	HOURS	DESCRIPTION
First Year Writing I	3	Complete <u>Hon 101, Writ 100</u> or <u>Writ 101</u> with a passing grade.
First Year Writing II	3	Complete one of the following courses with a passing grade: Liba 102, Writ 102 or Hon 102.
6 hrs literature survey	6	Complete 6 hours of literature survey with a passing grade. Choose from the following courses: Eng 220, 221, 222, 223, 224, 225, or Eng 226.
6 hrs modern/ancient language 200+	6	Successfully complete at least 6 hours at the 200 level or above in one modern or ancient language.
6 hrs history	6	Complete 6 hours in History (HST) course work with a passing grade.
3 hrs humanities	3	African American studies; classical civilization; environmental studies 101, gender studies ( <u>G St 201, 301, 333</u> , <u>350</u> ); <u>Liba 202, 305</u> , <u>312</u> ; philosophy; religion; Southern studies ( <u>Any 100</u> level); <u>Rhet 201</u> . In addition, gender studies courses that are cross-listed with African American studies, classical civilization, English, modern languages, philosophy, or religion courses will satisfy this requirement.
6 hrs social science	6	Successfully complete 6 semester hours in anthropology, economics, political science, psychology, or sociology.
3 hrs fine arts	3	The course may be chosen from art history, music, dance, and theatre arts. Studio and workshop courses cannot be used to satisfy this requirement. Courses that satisfy this requirement are any Art History (AH); Liba 130, 204, 314; Mus 101, 102, 103, 104, 105; Danc 200; Thea 201, 202. Students who have completed 30 semester hours of undergraduate course work may fulfill the requirement with a 300- or 400-level art history course.
3 hrs math 100+	3	Successfully complete 3 hours of Math at the 100 level or above except for Math 245 and Math 246.
9-12 hrs science	11	Courses may be chosen from astronomy, biology, chemistry, geology, <u>Liba 205</u> , 205L, 150, 151, 315, 315L and physics. Two semesters of course work in one subject and one semester in a subject from another department are required. Each course must be a minimum of 3 credit hours. At least two of the courses taken must include laboratories.

8 hrs physics track	8	Complete one of the following physics tracks: Track 1 - Phys 211, 212, 221, 222 Track 2 - Phys 213, 214, 223, 224
<u>Phys 303</u>	3	Complete Phys 303 with a passing grade.
<u>Phys 319</u>	3	Complete Phys 319 with a passing grade.
16 hrs Phys electives	16	Successfully complete 16 hours of Physics course work at the 300 level or higher.
6 hrs 400+ level	6	Of the 16 hrs of physics electives 6 hours must be at the 400 level or higher.
2-3 hrs of <u>Phys 461</u> /463/464	2	Of the 6 hours of physics courses at the 400 level and above, at least 2 but no more than 3 hours must be chosen from Phys 461, 463 and/or 464.
