

BMS 664: Chemistry & Standardization of Cannabis Biomolecular Sciences

BMS 664 is an asynchronous online course where students will learn how to identify and standardize Cannabis spp. and individual molecules including cannabinoids and terpenes. We will cover the macro and microscopic botanical characteristics of cannabis before learning optimal extraction methodology and analytical machines, as well as how to standardize previously identified constituents. By the end of the course, students will be able to demonstrate their ability to develop a hypothetical extraction and/or standardization scheme based on their foundational knowledge. 3 Credits
