

Anth 329: Crime, Insecurity, & Law in Latin Am **Sociology & Anthropology**

This course explores the interface between crime, violence, insecurity, and law in Latin America and the Caribbean. Civilians contend with the insecurity produced by armed actors: organized crime groups, militias, paramilitaries, and state security forces. Crime and violence strain existing legal systems and constitutional republics. This has precipitated a search for new ways to promote law and security and to curb crime and violence.
