

Phys 212: Physics for Science & Engineering II Physics & Astronomy

This course is the second part of a two-semester calculus-based treatment of introductory physics. Topics include electricity, magnetism, electromagnetic waves and optics. Of the courses Phys 108, Phys 212, and Phys 214, only one can be counted toward a degree.
