

Geog 344: Gender, Kinship, & Citizenship in Korea

This course explores shifting gender roles and the evolution of the Korean family in divided Korea and in Korean diasporic communities. It also explores intersections of citizenship, nationalism, and multiculturalism in both North Korea and South Korea. Topics include family and war, women's work, queer and trans politics, overseas adoption, the South Korean culture industry, and the cultural influence of the United States in Korea.
